REMINDER: TERM 1 FEES & HOW TO PAY

Term 1 fees will be mailed out shortly. Fees are to be paid by 15 March 2013 unless paying by Direct Debit or other approved payment method.

The following methods of payment are available:

CASH OR CHEQUE

Cheque payments may be posted to the College and cash or cheque payments may be paid in person at both Isabella and Wanniassa Campus.

DIRECT DEBIT

Payment of School Fees by Direct Debit will require completion of the relevant paperwork. Please contact the Accounts office to set up your Direct Debit which can commence at any time through the year. All Direct Debits continue throughout the year, they do not suspend for the term holidays, unless upon request.

CREDIT CARD - MASTERCARD OR VISA

These payments can be made in person, over the telephone, or details can be provided at the bottom of your school fee statement.

EFTPOS

I introduced myself in the last newsletter but if you happened to miss that issue, my name is Colby Cruwys and I'm the new Senior Studies Coordinator. I'm hoping to include a short article in all our newsletters in order to inform you about what's happening in the life of our Senior students as well as provide some tips that you and your sons and daughters might be able to benefit from.

On Tuesday 19 February our Tertiary Year 12 students had the opportunity to engage in the Queensland Cognitive Skills test. For us it's a great practice opportunity for those students looking to receive an ATAR before they are required to sit the AST in September. They have no pressure and it informs us of areas that we might be able to focus on in future trials and AST workshops.

On Wednesday 20 February, all of Year 12 were invited to interviews to discuss their future paths and what MacKillop can do to help them reach their goals for 2013 and beyond.

Year 12 is the end of a long journey for our students and the last chance we as a College get to leave a long-lasting positive imprint in their lives. We encourage our Year 12 students at this point in their journey to consider how they spend their final year at MacKillop, what they want to get from it and what kind of legacy they'd like to leave for our younger students to remember.

The next big event for both Year 11 and 12 students will be the AST trials on Tuesday 5 March. All students wishing to attain an ATAR are required to be at school as normal on that day to sit practice AST-style exams. These practices are how we prepare them for the actual AST tests but also help us identify areas for growth.

PASTORAL CARE AT WANNIASSA

Welcome back to the 2013 school year and in particular new families who have joined our community. As discussed at recent parent information evenings, students on the Wanniassa Campus have made a positive and settled return to school.

PASTORAL TEAMS

Many parents have already met and spoken to their sons and daughters PC Teachers. It is reassuring that in the majority of Year 8 and 9 classes the PC Teacher has remained unchanged.

The Pastoral Care Coordinators, who work closely with their team of PC Teachers and provide leadership to each cohort have been working closely with students to ensure the year has commenced in a successful fashion. The Pastoral Care Coordinators for each Year group on the Wanniassa campus in 2013 are Mrs Kate Durham and Mr Phil Belcher (Year 7), Mrs Sharyn Quirk and Mr Gary Pickering (Year 8), and Mrs Colleen Kain and Mr Steve Lowe (Year 9). Parents are encouraged to make contact with class teachers or their son or daughter's PC Teacher should they have any concerns about their progress.

STATUS

The College has a Status System whereby students are recognised, affirmed and rewarded for their positive behaviours. Students may progress to the levels of Bronze, Silver or Gold Status. This system was reviewed in late 2012 by staff and students. A number of changes have been implemented following this review and took into account many ideas suggested by the students.

The refreshed system has been advertised to all students and they are encouraged to seek recognition for their positive contributions to the life of MacKillop through aiming for the progressions of Bronze, Silver and Gold Status. All students have been issued a "Merit Point Record" card as a means of tracking merit points issued by staff. When students have met the criteria for each level they should see their Pastoral Care Coordinator for an application form.

Students who obtain any level of Status will be presented at Campus Assemblies and be recognised in the College Newsletter. A number of other privileges will also be issued depending upon the level achieved.

UNIFORM

The standard of uniform has been exceptionally high to start the year. A culture has been established whereby students take care in the way they present themselves and represent the College. Thus they wear the MacKillop uniform with pride. The uniform policy states "the FULL MacKillop uniform is to be worn to and from school each day". Thank you to those families who when necessary encourage their boys and girls to wear the uniform correctly. Thank you also to all families who have taken the time and effort to purchase school shoes that are in line with College policy. The response to the information that was distributed in the Newsletter in late 2012 and the information disseminated to students through various mediums has been particularly positive.

Please note that if there are circumstances that prevent students from wearing the correct uniform, they are required to bring a signed note from their parents to explain the situation. This needs to be presented to their Pastoral Care Coordinator during PC time each morning so that a uniform pass can be obtained.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

For the safety of all students we ask that when parents or family members are dropping students off at the College in the morning or picking them up the end of the day that arrangements be made for this to happen on the basketball courts. There have been a number of 'near misses' involving students being dropped off or collected on Mackinnon St and McBryde Cres. The small car park at the front of the College is not big enough to cater for the demands at these peak times and is only to be used by visitors during the day and across campus teaching staff.

HOMEWORK CLUB

All Wanniassa students are invited to attend the Homework Club in the Wanniassa IRC from 3:30-4:30 Mondays to Thursdays. Students can find help with their studies in a relaxed, peaceful atmosphere.

A PARENT'S IPHONE CONTACT (continued from Pastoral Report)



12/25/2012 Dear Gregory,

Merry Christmas! You are now the proud owner of an iPhone. Hot Damn! You are a good & responsible 13 year old boy and you deserve this gift. But with the acceptance of this present comes rules and regulations. Please read through the following contract. I hope that you understand it is my job to raise you into a well rounded, healthy young man that can function in the world and coexist with technology, not be ruled by it. Failure to comply with the following list will result in termination of your iPhone ownership. I love you madly & look forward to sharing several million text messages with you in the days to come.

- 1. It is my phone. I bought it. I pay for it. I am loaning it to you. Aren't I the greatest?
- 2. I will always know the password.
- 3. If it rings, answer it. It is a phone. Say hello, use your manners. Do not ever ignore a phone call if the screen reads "Mom" or "Dad". Not ever.
- 4. Hand the phone to one of your parents promptly at 7:30pm every school night & every weekend night at 9:00pm. It will be shut off for the night and turned on again at 7:30am.
